Dear Resident,

The Long Island Rail Road and their construction contractor (Posillico Environmental) will be initiating a remediation project at the Manhasset Substation during the week of May 23rd. As you may be aware, there are two areas where soil remediation will be occurring as part of this project. One area is the LIRR right-of-way between Virginia Drive and the LIRR train tracks and the other area is at the edge of Manhasset Bay (along Bayview Avenue, just north of the LIRR viaduct). Some of the initial activities that will be undertaken at both locations at the start of the project will include the following:

- Mobilization of equipment, materials and supplies,
- Installation of temporary construction fencing and silt fencing, where necessary, along Virginia Drive,
- Clearing and grubbing of vegetation on LIRR property and along Virginia Drive (not including large trees),
- Construction of decontamination pad, and
- Posting of construction signage.

The LIRR expects that these initial site set-up activities will take approximately two to three days and then soil excavation and removal will commence. Soil remediation within the LIRR right-of-way (adjacent to Virginia Drive) will be handled first and should take approximately 6 to 8 weeks to complete. As you may recall, this work will also include drainage improvements, and new fencing and landscaping. Remediation of sediment at the edge of Manhasset Bay will occur secondly, and should take approximately 4 weeks to complete. As a reminder to residents, while our crew is working in the vicinity of Virginia Drive, our work hours will be from approximately 9am to 3pm each day.
